Consultation Day a Success



It was agreed by all that the consultation that was held at Llanfair on 23rd February, 2015 was a great success, led by the Revd. Peter Noble. The consultation was the result of the meetings held by local volunteers, the residential team, and members of the Sponsoring Body following "the crisis" of July 2014, when it was thought that Llanfair might have to close. The determination and hard work that ensued, ably supported by John and Norah Morgans, culminated in the presentation of the life and work of Llanfair to a wider audience.

The day began when the children of Penrhys Primary School sang Llanfair's theme song "One More Step Along The Way". Local volunteers, the residential team, and church members then spoke about the history of Penrhys and the continuing work of Llanfair - how important Llanfair is to them personally and to the wider community. A number of workshops were held, in which ideas and suggestions for the future of Llanfair were discussed.

After lunch, we prayed and gave thanks for the chapels and churches that were once abundant in the valleys, especially those, most of which have now closed, in and around Tylorstown and for those who had laid the foundations for a church in Penrhys.

The conference closed with a rousing rendition of "Cwm Rhondda".
